### **BPS PO 2021 Application Form:**

The application form will be released in August 2021. Move to the official website and collect the form. Fill all the details carefully after reading all the info carefully. Make sure for filling all the details whether academic or personal correctly and if any detail is inspected as incorrect then the exam will be canceled at the same time. Once you are done with the form filling formalities, upload the scanned images, signature, and photograph. Lastly, pay the application fee along with form submission. Here are some important points to keep in mind while filling the application form:

- The aspirant's name and guardian's name should be written. Certificates and mark sheets also should be clear. If any dissimilarity is found then the candidate will be considered disqualified.
- Before submitting the application form, check all the details carefully because later, after submitting the form, you are not allowed to make any alterations in the form.

- First of all, visit the IBPS official website **www.ibps.in**
- Then click the tab '**APPLY ONLINE FOR CWE-PROBATIONARY OFFICERS/ MANAGEMENT TRAINEES**' for accessing the online application form.
- Once you catch hold of an application form, register the application by entering basic but important information in the online form.
- Fill entire details carefully and it is suggested to go through all the instructions before filling the form.

- Registration number, as well as a password, will automatically generate and sent to the candidates through email or SMS onto registered email address and mobile number.

**Upload the Latest Photo and Signature and in this Regard, Read the Related Instructions Below:**

- Ensure for uploading passport size, latest, and colored photo.
  - Image dimension should be 200 x 230, Pixel file type will be JPG, the file size should be 20 KB – 50 KB.
  - The applicant's signature should have dimensions of 140 X 60, Pixels File Type will be JPG, and file size should be 10 KB – 20 KB.
- IBPS Bank Exam 2021 Application fee:
- The cost of the application fee will be **Rs.600/-** and for reserved categories, it is **Rs.100/-**
  - You can pay the application fee via online mode only. The application form is incorporated with the payment gateway and payment can be made via Internet Banking, IMPS, Debit or Credit Cards, Cash Cards/Mobile Wallets.
  - As soon as payment is done, you will receive an e-receipt which the candidate is expected to acquire along with the application form.

**Eligibility Criteria:**

Candidates must check the eligibility criteria before applying for the IBPS PO Exam:

- The candidate must be Indian.
- The candidate is subject to Nepal or Bhutan.
- Tibetan refugee who is permanently settled in India before 1st January 1962 can also apply.
- Those who are originated in India and migrated from countries like Burma, Vietnam, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Malawi, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Kenya, Zaire, or Zambia to reside permanently in India can also apply for an examination.
- Candidates must have good command over languages like Hindi, English & other local languages.
- The appropriate age to apply must be between 20 and 30 as of August 2021. However, age relaxation for those who belong to the reserved category.
- Candidate must have completed graduation from some recognized university in any of the disciplines with at least 60% marks (General category) and 55% for reserved category candidates.

**Age Relaxation Follows Below:**

- Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes will be given age relaxation of 05 years.

- Other Backward Classes – Non-Creamy Layer or OBC-NCL will be given age relaxation of 03 years.
- Persons with Disability (PWD) will be given age relaxation of 10 years.
- Ex-Servicemen, Short Service Commissioned Officers), Commissioned Officers (including Emergency Commissioned Officers, who were in service for 5-years and resigned as per the assigned project will get age relaxation of 5 years.
- The original residents of the Kashmir Division of the State of J&K from January 1980 to December 1989 also get age relaxation of 05 years.
- Candidates affected by the 1984 riots will get 05 years age relaxation.

**Selection Process:**

- The Selection Process for the IBPS PO 2021 has three stages – Preliminary exam, Main Exam, and Interview round.
- The first stage will be the Preliminary exam. It will be conducted only to shortlist candidates for the main exam.
- Candidates who qualify prelims exam will have to appear in the main exam.
- The second stage will be the Main exam consists of an objective and a descriptive paper.
- Candidates who clear the main exam will be invited for a personal interview of 100 marks.

**Exam Pattern for the Preliminary Exam:**

- Prelims will take place in online mode. The questions will be based on the Multiple Choice Questions pattern.
- The questions will appear in three different sections such as Quantitative Aptitude, Reasoning Ability, and English Language.
- In all, there will be 100 questions for 100 marks.
- The candidate needs to complete the examination within an hour.
- The question paper will appear in languages like English and Hindi.
- Every incorrect answer will lead to a reduction of 0.25 marks.

**Exam Pattern for the Main Exam:**

- The question paper will appear in online mode.
- Candidates are required to complete the test within 2 hours of time duration.
- Overall, there will be 200 questions for 200 marks.

- There will be 5 different sections in the exam such as Quantitative Aptitude, Reasoning, General Awareness, English Language, and Computer Knowledge.
- The question paper will appear in languages like English and Hindi excluding the English section.
- There is a negative marking with a deduction of 0.25 marks for every mistake.

## IBPS PO Syllabus 2021

The aspirants are recommended to go through the IBPS PO 2021 syllabus and read complete syllabus very carefully. The IBPS PO exam consists of questions from the subjects like General Awareness, Quantitative Aptitude, Reasoning, and English. Each subject covers various topics hence applicants have to practice hard. It is very important to prepare as per the prescribed syllabus to score good marks in the exam. Candidates can check here some subject wise important topics with regard to IBPS PO Syllabus:

### *General Awareness*

Banking & Financial Awareness, Current Affairs, Static GK, Sports, Famous Author & Books, Famous Events, Computer knowledge such as History of Computer, Fundamentals of Computer, Internet MS Office, Computer Shortcuts, Input-Output devices, etc.

### *Quantitative Aptitude*

Profit & Loss, Percentage & Averages, Work & Time, Simplification, Mixtures & Allegations, Ratio & Proportion, Time & Distance, Simple Interest & Compound Interest, Sequence & Series, Quadratic Equation, Permutation & Combination etc.

### **Interview:**

The final round of the IBPS PO 2021 exam will be Interview Round. The interview round will be of 100 marks. It will be an offline face to face interaction. Interviews will be conducted by the participating and nodal banks in each state. The personal interview will be based on the Candidates' traits and communication skills. The qualifying marks are 40 marks (General candidates) and 35 marks (reserved candidates). The final merit list will be based on the candidate's performances in the main exam and interview only in the ratio 80:20.

### **Admit Card:**

- Download the admit card from the main official website. Candidates will be given three Hall tickets. Each one of them is separate for Preliminary, for the Main Exam, and Interview. The admit card will issue for those applicants who have appeared in Prelims and those who have successfully done with the main exam.

### **Steps to get Admit Card are as follows:**

- First of all move to the main website of IBPS.
- Then download the link IBPS PO 2021.
- Enter login credentials such as Provisional ID and Password received during the submission of the application form.
- Check all the details in the admit card and get print out.
- Please note that candidates must appear to the examination center with documents like admit card, photo ID proof (original as well as a photocopy).

**Answer Key:**

The proviso of the answer key is helpful for applicants as this would help them to compare the answers from the answer key for IBPS PO 2021. It is easy to upload the answer key after the exam gets over. The answer key will be provided from the official website

**IBPS PO Result 2021:**

The result will be declared soon after the completion of the IBPS PO 2021 examination. Check out the result from the main website and those who successfully finish off the Prelims will move for Mains where candidate need to attain minimum cut-off scores for qualifying for the interview round

**Steps to Download IBPS PO Scorecard:**

- First of all visit the official website **www.ibps.in**
- Then click ‘CWE VII PO/MT’ tab
- Go to the link ‘IBPS PO 2021 Result’
- After this, enter the Password, Registration ID, as well as Date of Birth
- Lastly, Verify and Click Submit
- The scorecard will appear consisting of details like maximum marks in every section, minimum cut off marks, scores acquired by the candidate
- Download and print the scorecard for further need

**Cut-Off Marks:**

The cut off marks will be provided by the examination authority. This may change every year. Applicants are required to attain the specified cut off marks to get through the exam.

**Interview Process and Provisional Allotment:**

- Those who successfully clear Mains will be invited for an interview commenced by Participating Organizations in coordination with IBPS. The interview consisted of 100 marks and minimum qualifying marks are 40 but 35 for SC/ST/OBC/PWD candidates. During the time of the interview, carry important documents like:
  - Print out of the Interview Call Letter
  - Copy of the system-generated filled-in preview of the online application form of IBPS PO 2021
  - Proofs like Photo ID, DOB, and Caste/Disability/ or any other Certificate in support of claiming for reservation, if needed
  - Qualifying Examination Certificates.

**Step 5:** Upload the scanned images of Photo (4.5cm × 3.5cm), Signature in small letters (10kb – 20kb) & left thumb impression

**Step 6:** Pay Application Fees; Rs 750 for GEN/OBC/Unreserved and Rs 175 for SC/ST/PwD

**Step 7:** Save the confirmation page

## IBPS SO Eligibility Criteria

Before applying for the IBPS SO Recruitment, candidates must make sure that they fulfill the given eligibility criteria such as nationality, age limit and educational qualification. Have a look at detailed eligibility criteria below:

### Nationality/Citizenship

Candidates should be either Citizen of India OR the Subject of Nepal/Bhutan OR a Tibetan Refugee who got settled in India before January 1, 1962. Candidate can be a person of Indian origin who had migrated from East African countries (Uganda, Kenya, Malawi, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Zambia) Zaire or Vietnam/Pakistan/Burma/Sri Lanka for settling in India.

### Age Limit & Relaxation in Age

The minimum age limit to apply online for IBPS SO should be 20 years and the maximum age limit is 30 years as on 1 November OF EXAM YEAR. However, the upper age limit is relaxed for various categories

### IBPS SO Selection Process 2020

The IBPS SO Selection Process 2020 involves:

- Preliminary Exam
- Mains Exam
- Interview

### IBPS Clerk 2021 Eligibility

#### IBPS CLERK Eligibility Criteria 2021

Candidates should check whether they fulfill the IBPS Clerk 2021 Eligibility before application. The **eligibility** required for IBPS Clerk 2021 Eligibility is as follows:

#### APPLY NOWCHECK ELIGIBILITYGET UPDATES

- Candidates are required to apply for vacancies in ANYONE State/Union Territory.
- Bachelor's degree in any discipline or any equivalent qualification from a University/ Institution/ Board recognized by Government of India or approved by Government Regulatory Bodies.

- Candidates must have passed the qualifying exam before 9 October 2020; final year students are not eligible to apply for the exam.
- The age limit for IBPS Clerk 2021 is a minimum of 20 years and a maximum of 28 years as of 1 September 2021. Age limit relaxation is applicable for various categories as per norms.
- Candidates must have computer literacy. Any certificate/degree/diploma in computer operations or language, or candidates must have studied IT either in High school or college.
- Candidates must have working proficiency in the language of the state they have/wish to apply.

The upper age relaxation limit for IBPS Clerk 2021 is as follows:

### IBPS Clerk Application Process 2021

IBPS Clerk 2021 **Application Form** will be available in September 2021. Candidates are required to apply through online mode only. Here is the step-by-step process:

- Click on “New Registration” for CRP Clerks-X 2021
- Fill in your details such as name, Date of Birth, email ID and mobile number
- Registration number and password will be sent on the registered email ID and mobile number
- Login with the credentials to proceed
- Fill in personal, educational details, contact, category, state of choice, preferred exam centre, etc.
- Upload scanned photograph, signature, left thumb impression and handwritten declaration, etc.

- Process IBPS Clerk Application Fees, as per category, through online mode
- Download and save the accepted Application form and fee receipt for further process

- Cloze test's weightage is around 10-15 marks; candidates should practice well in order to score the marks.
- Consistent effort/preparation and solving previous years' question papers are key to qualifying this exam.

### **IBPS Clerk Eligibility as per Educational Qualification**

- A. **IBPS Clerk Degree Eligibility:** In order to pass IBPS Clerk eligibility criteria, a candidate should have a degree (Graduation) in any discipline from Government of India recognised college/ university, as on 12/09/2020. Candidates having any equivalent qualification that is recognized by Central Government are also eligible to apply.
- B. **Other Requirements:** Computer Literacy is a must. Candidate must possess operating as well as working knowledge of Computer System. For this, candidates should have followed -
  - (a) Degree/ Diploma/ Certificate in Computer Operations/ Language
  - Or**
  - (b) Should have studied Computer/ Information Technology as one of the subjects in High School/ Institute/ College.
- C. **Proficiency in Local Language:** Candidates should also be proficient in the language of the state from which they are applying. This means that the candidates should know how to read, write and speak the official language of the state of union territory from which they are applying.
  - In cases where the college/ university provides CGPA or OGPA, candidates need to convert the same into the percentage, up to 2 places of decimal and accordingly fill it in the application form.

- The selected candidates are also required to produce a certificate, mentioning the university norms for the grade to percentage conversion as well as the percentage of marks that the student has secured, and it should be signed by an appropriate authority.
- For candidates from colleges/ universities where web certificate is released or the result is published online, the candidates must produce a relevant document, signed by the appropriate authority, in original, with clear mention of candidate's date of passing.
- Candidate should indicate the percentage obtained in Graduation calculated to the nearest two decimals in the online application. Where CGPA / OGPA is awarded, the same should be converted into percentage and indicated in online application. The candidate will have to produce a certificate issued by the appropriate authority inter alia stating that the norms of the University regarding conversion of grade into percentage of marks scored by the candidate in terms of norms.
- Ex-servicemen who do not possess the above civil examination qualifications should be matriculate Ex-servicemen who have obtained the Army Special Certificate of Education or corresponding certificate in the Navy or Air Force after having completed not less than 15 years of service in the Armed Forces of the Union as on October 10, 2020. Such certificates should be dated on or before October 10, 2020.

#### **IBPS Clerk Eligibility as per Age Limit**

- Age is another factor which affects the eligibility of a candidate.
- To apply for IBPS Clerk Exam, candidate must be at least 20 years and maximum age limit is 28 years.
- Although IBPS Clerk notification has laid down the limitations pertaining to age, there are relaxations for certain section of people.
- Follow the table given below to know about relaxations for **IBPS Clerk**:

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- The relaxation in upper age limit to SC / ST / OBC candidates is allowed on a cumulative basis with only one of the remaining categories for which age relaxation is permitted as mentioned above.
- The maximum age limit specified is applicable to General Category candidates and Economically Weaker (EWS) Category Candidates.
- Candidates seeking age relaxation will be required to submit necessary certificate(s) in original / copies at the time of joining and at any subsequent stage of the recruitment process as required by IBPS / Participating Organization(s).
- The following rules apply to Ex-Servicemen re-employed under the Central government would apply to Ex-Servicemen candidates appearing for the examination:
- Ex-Servicemen candidates who have already secured employment under the Central Government in Group 'C' and 'D' will be permitted the benefit of age relaxation as prescribed for Ex-Servicemen for securing another employment in a higher grade or cadre in Group 'C' / 'D' under the Central Government. However, such candidates will not be eligible for the benefit of reservation on the second occasion for Ex-Servicemen in Central Government jobs. An Ex-Serviceman who has once joined a government job on civil side after availing of the benefits given to him/her as an Ex-Servicemen for his / her re-employment, his / her ex-servicemen status will be governed in terms of OM No. 36034/1/2014 Estt. (Res.) dated August 14, 2014 of Government of India, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances, and Pensions.
- Candidates who are still in the armed forces and desirous of applying under Ex-Servicemen category whose date of completion of a specific period of engagement (SPE) is completed one year from the last date for receipt of online application i.e. on or before October 8, 2020 are eligible to apply.

### **IBPS Clerk Citizenship/ Nationality**

A candidate must be either of the following:

- An Indian National or can be a citizen of Nepal or Bhutan or Tibetan Refugee who have settled in India.
- A person of Indian origin who has originally migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania (formerly Tanganyika and Zanzibar), Zambia, Malawi, Zaire, Ethiopia and Vietnam to permanently settle in India.
- Candidate belonging to countries other than India must present an eligibility certificate issued by authorities recommended by Government of India.

### **IBPS Clerk Reservation**

**IBPS** in accordance with section 34 of "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016", persons with benchmark disabilities are eligible for Reservation. The post is identified as suitable for the persons with under noted categories of disabilities as defined in the Schedule of RPWD Act 2016 and notified by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) from time to time.

- Please note that **no change** of category will be permitted at any stage after registration of the online application and the result will be processed considering the category which has been indicated in the online application, subject to guidelines of the Government of India in this regard. Merely applying for CRP / appearing for and being shortlisted in the online examination (Preliminary and Main) and / or in subsequent processes does not imply that a candidate will necessarily be offered employment in any of the Participating Organizations.
- No request for considering the candidature under any category other than the one in which one has applied will be entertained.
