

In my opinion, NSS is a platform for overall development of an individual's personality. I strongly feel that strengthening NSS leads to the strengthening of society. I compliment Dr.K. Kalachanne Gowda, Programme Co-ordinator and his team for consolidating the outstanding contributions in this newsletter and also introducing and implementing innovative programmes through the NSS units of colleges coming under University of Mysore. EDITORIAL



NSS was started in 37 Universities across the country in 1969, the University of Mysore being one among them. UoM started its innings in 1969 with a strength of 1,100 volunteers in selected 11 colleges. Having grown steadily over the years, currently, it is 127 colleges with a volunteer strength of 17,823. National Service Scheme started operating from Centenary Building located in the lush green campus of Maharaja's College, a constituent college of the University of Mysore.

Under the leadership of Prof. U.K. Subbarayachar, Honorary Director of NSS, the three page guidelines given by the Government of India was expanded to twenty pages. A model Inter-Collegiate Camp (ICC), which was one of its kind in the country was formulated and successfully implemented. In his name an award has been instituted at the University Level, for best two volunteers (Male and Female). The then successors of Prof. U.K. Subbarayachar continued the rich tradition and started District Level Camps and Training for Programme Officers. They gave a creative touch by composing NSS song. Under the guidance of various Vice-Chancellors of the University of Mysore, 7 Co-ordinators did their best in effective implementation of the NSS objectives.

Through diverse service activities, the University of Mysore was able to develop



a good rapport between educational institutions and the community. University of Mysore has also worked in implementation of various schemes of the Government of India. The NSS has also significantly contributed towards retaining Mysuru city as the Cleanest City in the country and the First Open Defecation-free City.

The NSS wing of the University of Mysore has made an outstanding contribution towards Youth Development and National Service in the past 47 years. 3.1 lakh Volunteers have been trained for social service so far. 6,500 programme officers have contributed towards the growth of NSS. 4,520 programme officers have been trained through TOC and ETI of the University of Mysore. NSS programmes have been prioritized for National Missions (Swachh Bharat, Koushal Bharat, Bheti Padavo Bheti Bhachavo, Social Security Schemes, Open Defecation-Free India, Green Energy Consciousness, Global Peace, Ethics in Life).

The NSS wing of the University of Mysore is proud to bring out 'Samarpan', a newsletter. Its main intention is to keep continuity in the documentation of the NSS programmes and also to give publicity to various activities of NSS.

The NSS wing of the University of Mysore has a legacy of innovative projects and programmes to it's credit. Demonstration projects need to be recorded and published for the guidance of new units. The qualitative programmes undertaken so far are testimony to the effective participation of volunteers and programme officers. Meagre though it is, by publishing their activities, we hope to encourage them. This issue gives a brief insight into the NSS activities conducted between January and June, 2016.

ಪ್ರೊ. ಉ. ಕಾ. ಸುಬ್ಬರಾಯಾಚಾರ್ ಅವರು 1919ರ ಅಕ್ಟೋಬರ್ ತಿಂಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಶೃಂಗೇರಿಯಲ್ಲಿ ಜನಿಸಿದರು. ಅವರ ಪೂರ್ವಜರು ಉಡುಪಿಯ ಹತ್ತಿರದ ಕಲ್ಯಾಣಪುರದವರು. ತಂದೆ ಶ್ರೀಕಾಳಯ್ಯಾಚಾರ್ಯ ಮತ್ತು ತಾಯಿ ಚೆಲುವಮ್ಮ. ಶ್ರೀಮತಿ

ಚೆಲುವಮ್ಮ ಅವರ ತವರೂರು ಶೃಂಗೇರಿ. ಈ ದಂಪತಿಗಳ ಹಿರಿಯ ಪುತ್ರ ಶ್ರೀ ಉ.ಕಾ. ಸುಬ್ಬರಾಯಾಚಾರ್. ನಂತರ ತಂಗಿ ಪದ್ಮಾವತಿ, ಆಮೇಲೆ ರಾಮಕೃಷ್ಣ, ಕೊನೆಯವರು ಶ್ರೀಮತಿ ಸುಶೀಲಾ. ಶ್ರೀ ಕಾಳಯ್ಯಾಚಾರ್ಯರು ತುಂಬಾ ಸ್ಥಿತಿವಂತರೇನಲ್ಲಾ. ಸಣ್ಣದಾಗಿ ಚಿನ್ನ, ಬೆಳ್ಳಿ ವ್ಯಾಪಾರ ಮಾಡುತ್ತಿದ್ದರು. ಶ್ರೀ ಕಾಳಯ್ಯಾಚಾರ್ಯ ಅವರು ತೀರ್ಥಹಳ್ಳಿಗೆ ಬಂದು ವೃತ್ತಿಯನ್ನು ಮುಂದುವರಿಸುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಶ್ರೀ ಉ. ಕಾ. ಸುಬ್ಬರಾಯಾಚಾರ್ ಅವರು (ಉ.ಕಾ.ಸು.) ತಮ್ಮ ಹದಿಮೂರನೇ ವಯಸ್ಸಿನಲ್ಲಿ ತಾಯಿಯನ್ನು, ಹದಿನೆಂಟನೇ ವಯಸ್ಸಿನಲ್ಲಿ ತಂದೆಯನ್ನು ಕಳೆದುಕೊಂಡು ತಬ್ಬಲಿಯಾಗುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಅಲ್ಲದೆ ಸಹೋದರ ಸಹೋದರಿಯರ ಜವಾಬ್ದಾರಿಯನ್ನು ಚಿಕ್ಕವಯಸ್ಸಿನಲ್ಲಿ ನಿರ್ವಹಿಸಲು ತೊಡಗುತ್ತಾರೆ.







REPORT OF THE SEMINAR

Mysuru, May 30: "We should instill the principles of Mahatma Gandhiji by reaching out to the common man of this country through the National Service Scheme. It is essential to re – look, re-think and re-examine as to what we have learnt? what we have preached? what we have practiced? and what we have achieved in N.S.S. so far?" opined Sri. A.N.Pujar, Regional Director, Directorate of N.S.S., Government of India.







Sri. A.N.Pujar was the Guest of Honour in the two day national seminar on 'Revisiting NSS - A SWOT Perspective', organized by National Service Scheme of University of Mysore at the Centenary Hall of Maharaja's College. Addressing the gathering he said, N.S.S. was started during the birth centenary year of Mahatma Gandhiji. It is very apt and befitting to review the progress of N.S.S. in the centenary celebration year of University of Mysore, which was one of the first 37 universities to start N.S.S. in a grand scale. When the whole society is behind money and materialistic pleasures, it is through N.S.S. we have to inculcate necessary values like dignity of labour, patriotism, simplicity and service attitude in our youth.

He further added that, University Grants Commission has given its consent to start N.S.S. as one of the optional subjects in under graduation. Lots of thinking is going on to wave off the workload of N.S.S. Programme Officers and to consider N.S.S. activities as an important aspect under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS). Government is taking necessary steps to start N.S.S. units in Engineering and Medical Colleges. The prize amount to be given to the best N.S.S. Programme Officers has been increased to 70,000 rupees and prize amount for best N.S.S. Volunteers has been increased to 30,000 rupees. It is high time that we make N.S.S. more people friendly.



Prof. C.Basavaraju, Registrar of University of Mysore in his key note address said that, National Service Scheme is an important and integral part of our college education system. What we cannot achieve through our formal education, we can achieve it through N.S.S. We have to develop nationalism, unity and brotherhood among the younger generation so that we can build an ideal society.



Prof. K.S. Rangappa, Vice-Chancellor of University of Mysore in his presidential address said that, N.S.S. which started with 47,000 volunteers has now grown into a massive institution having 32 lakh volunteers in 32,000 colleges spread across the length and breadth of the country. In Karnataka itself we have 3 lakh N.S.S. volunteers. He remembered the days when he started a N.S.S. unit and a Training Centre for N.S.S. Programme Officers at Karnataka State Open University during his Vice-Chancellorship. He told that, University of Mysore is coming up with a N.S.S. Bhavan. Students of University of Mysore from the coming academic year can study 'Youth and National Service' as one of the optional subjects, which is a one of its kind initiatives in the country.

He further said that, N.S.S. volunteers should involve themselves in eradicating the blind beliefs and superstitions which are deeply rooted in the rural areas. Volunteers should develop scientific temperament among the people. The Government should financially



empower the National Service Scheme. The N.S.S. volunteers should join hands with the projects of the Central Government like Clean India Campaign, Skill India, Make in India etc., and work towards their success. If lakhs of N.S.S. volunteers make up their mind and work sincerely, by 2019 India will be a clean country. Keeping in mind the future of N.S.S., we should chalk out proper strategies and action plans so that we can convert the weakness into strength and threats into opportunities.

Dr. K. Kalachanne Gowda, the N.S.S. Programme Co-ordinator of University of Mysore and the convener of the two day national seminar delivered the welcome speech during the inaugural session and gave an insight into why and how the seminar was organized. Prof. Manonmani proposed the vote of thanks. Dr. S.Venkataram anchored the programme. N.S.S. Programme Officers and N.S.S. volunteers from Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Uttarakand, Delhi, Rajasthan and Haryana took part in the seminar.

The Inaugural ceremony was followed by the 1st technical session. Dr. Thomas Abraham, Formed HOD, Dept. of Adult Education, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam spoke on the topic 'Volunteerism in the Age of Globalization'. He said, mother is the greatest volunteer on the face of earth. Her selflessness and dedication is a greatest lesson for all the N.S.S. volunteers.





Volunteerism becomes more useful to the society when it gets into a form of a social movement. People get into volunteerism for self-actualization and for self-development. In turn this will help in social re-construction. Volunteerism provides an opportunity for an individual to live one's value and passion.

He added that, many people think globalization as a threat. If we really make use of globalization in a logical way, we can create lots of opportunities for our youngsters. Education system is incomplete without N.S.S. We can easily differentiate a student who is in N.S.S. and a student who is not in N.S.S. A student involved in N.S.S. stands apart from the crowd. N.S.S. helps the volunteers in their personal transformation. N.S.S. Programme Officers work like the change agents in building a strong character among the volunteers.

B.K.Shivanna. N.S.S. Prof. former Programme Co-ordinator of University of Mysore chaired the 1st technical session. He remembered the days when N.S.S. started operating in University of Mysore, way back in 1969. Prof. H. Narasimaiah, a Gandhian inaugurated the N.S.S. activities in the University of Mysore. He recalled the words of Prof. H.Narasimaiah, who wanted the duration of the camp for at least 30 days, so that volunteers can really understand the culture and true scenario of rural India. He further said that, it is unfortunate that due to the introduction of semester scheme the duration



of 14 days camp has been reduced to 10 days and duration of 10 days camp has been reduced to 7 days. This is a major drawback for N.S.S.. Nowadays camps are been held just for showoff. The real intention and objectives are missing. We should not go to the villages with an attitude that we are going to teach the villagers. Instead we are there in the villages to learn and change ourselves.



The 2nd technical session started soon after the lunch. Dr. H.S. Suresh, former Deputy Programme Advisor, N.S.S. Regional Center spoke on 'N.S.S. Administration - Issues and Solutions'. He gave an elaborate presentation on strength, weakness, opportunities and threats related to N.S.S. He said that, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, who was the first Prime minister of our country, started National Discipline Scheme (NDS) in 1952 to bring discipline, self-control and service mindedness in the youth. Later after few years National Fitness Core (NFC) was started. When Kotari Commission gave the recommendations that a special unit needs to be started in all the universities of the country to prepare the youth for social service, then N.S.S. came into being. He further added that, 40% of the total N.S.S. volunteers are from South India, which is a matter of pride. Out of 800 universities in this country only 298 universities have N.S.S. units, which is a matter of shame. Only in Madhya Pradesh N.S.S. Programme Co-ordinators are appointed on a permanent basis. It would be better if this culture prevails everywhere. It is

painful to see many large states have very less enrollment of volunteers. If N.S.S. is shifted from Ministry of Youth Affairs to Ministry of Human Resource Development, then we can see some positive results.





Prof.G.B. Shivaraju, Honarary Secretary of Gandhi Bhavan, Bengaluru spoke on the topic 'Gandhi and the Youth' during the 2nd technical session. He said that, we cannot isolate Gandhi from youth. The whole idea of N.S.S. is based on Gandhian Philosophy. Youth are the assets of the society. The future of the society depends on them. Youth are not useless; they are used less. With proper guidance and motivation they can create wonders.

He further added that, our traditional education system has become nothing but marks card manufacturing factory. It has completely failed to instill human values among students. What we want is man making, character building and life making education as said by Swami Vivekananda. We can forget Gandhiji at our own peril. World can be a safe



place if we follow his footsteps. He was an embodiment of all human values. Currently we see parents teaching their children as to how to operate a computer, but they are unable to teach them how to operate their thoughts and emotions. Prof. B.K. Jagadisha, former Dean, Yuvaraja's College chaired the session. After the 2nd technical session cultural events were organized to entertain the participants of the seminar. The audience cherished the folk songs and folk dances performed on that occasion.







Mysuru, May 31: Prof. Anil S. Navale. former Dean. Faculty of Social Work, M.S.University, Baroda spoke on the topic 'Philosophical Foundations of NSS and Training Needs' during the 3rd technical session. He told, the country which takes care of its youth will prosper and the country which ignores its youth will perish. Instead of criticizing the youth we should keep faith in them.



He further said that, Jayachamarajendra Road in Baroda and Sayyaji Rao Road in Mysuru symbolize the respect and relationship between the royal families of Mysuru and Baroda. Both these families were responsible in bringing a revolution in the field of education, even before the independence of our country. There are lots of similarities between these two royal families. Both of them transformed their provinces into model states.

He remembered the words of John F. Kennedy who had said "Don't ask what nation has done to you. Ask what you have done to the nation". N.S.S. is wedded to development. N.S.S. is not just a scheme, it is a movement. People here work with a passion for service; they are not bothered for incentives and awards. It is remarkable as to how N.S.S. volunteers involved themselves in service activities during the earthquake which happened in Baruch, as well as Indo-Pak war during 1970-71. We need to re-shape N.S.S. according to the changing times.



Dr. Rajan M. Welukar, former Vice-Chancellor of Mumbai University spoke on the topic 'N.S.S. and Nation Building through Inclusive Empathetic Sensitivity' during the 3rd technical session. He said, the practicals based learning model developed by Mahatma Gandhiji during 1940s, holds good for all times. If today's youth has any regret for not been able to take part in the freedom movement of the country, for them N.S.S. is the best platform to do something good to the country. The beneficiaries of higher education should work towards the rejuvenation of the country by including and involving the people who are neglected and marginalized. We should bring innovation into N.S.S. to attract more number of youngsters. We should emulate the examples of foreign universities which allow the students of technical education to pursue humanities. Dr. Sathyanarayana, former Syndicate Member chaired the session.



Dr. Balasubramanyam, Chairman Vivekananda Youth Movement spoke on the topic 'Vision for India's Development' during the 4th technical session. He said, many politicians, academicians and media persons use the word 'development' without understanding its actual meaning. Indians Constitute 40% of America's medical fraternity. But we are not getting doctors who are ready to work in rural India. America's M.I.T. University publishes more number of research papers than all the Indian Universities put together. Yoga is a 28 billion dollar industry in America. But we still have a negligent attitude towards



He further said, India which was having 35% of world's GDP during 16th century is now a place of malnutrition and filth. If we have to bring back the glory of India, youth of this country should become physically, intellectually, emotionally and spiritually strong. Even the little steps we take and small decisions we make can contribute towards nation building. India, which has given so much to the world's civilization, is now standing with a begging bowl in front of other countries. We need to give more importance to human resource development than ever before. In this regard we have to re-define N.S.S and develop confidence in the youth.

Dr. Meena Deshpande, Professor, Political Science Department, Bangalore University spoke on the topic 'Women Empowerment through N.S.S.' during the 4th technical session. She said, today's youth are facing lots of diversions and distractions. N.S.S. is necessary for them to become good citizens and to lead a satisfactory life. Instead of instilling impractical ideals to the youth, we have to teach them values which are easy to follow and practice. N.S.S. has given a significant contribution to women's empowerment. By sharing responsibilities and participating in decision making process during the camps, girls are imbibing leadership qualities. We see a lot of women representatives in the local self-governments who have come from N.S.S. background. By looking at the girls participating in the camps, villagers' attitude towards girls has undergone a considerable



change. Dr. K.M. Veeraiah, Director, J.S.S. Karnataka Open School chaired the session.



Before the commencement of the 3rd technical session a condolence meeting was held to pay homage to Dr. D. Javare Gowda, former Vice-Chancellor of University of Mysore and a well-known Kannada writer who passed away on May 30. Delegates who were present at the seminar paid respect by offering floral tributes to the portrait of Dr. D. Javare Gowda.



The valedictory function was held soon after the completion of 4th technical session. Dr. Gananathashetty Ekkar, State N.S.S. Officer was the guest of honour. He said, the government has kept 18 crore rupees in the budget to support N.S.S. activities. All the fields have undergone a thorough change after the advent of globalization. If N.S.S. doesn't change with the changing times, it will have a bleak future and it will loose its importance. University of Mysore has a strong foundation as far as N.S.S. is concerned. The credit of

training thousands of N.S.S. Programme Officers should invariably go to University of Mysore.



He further said that, the government has kept aside 1 crore rupees for developing the database of N.S.S. volunteers. Incentives have been increased for both volunteers and Programme Officers. We should see to it that 20 hours of orientation programme regarding N.S.S. is delivered to the students at the college level. As we have failed to do so, students are unaware of the nature, scope, objectives and functions of National Service Scheme. If we don't blend technology with N.S.S. we will have to face set back in future.

He told that, Swami Vivekananda's concept of personality development and Mahatma Gandhiji's concept of rural empowerment can be realized only in N.S.S. The National Service Scheme is following the basic principles of Indian Constitution and committed to diversity, which is the core value of our culture. N.S.S. is not affiliated to any political or religious ideologies. Instead it enjoys autonomous power in thought and action. From this year 15 National Integration Camps will be held instead of 10 camps and 02 Youth Festivals will be conducted instead of 01.

Prof. B.K. Jagadisha, former Dean, Yuvaraja's College read out the recommendations of the two day national seminar to the audience present. Few of the participants were given an opportunity to













share their experiences regarding the seminar. Dr.K.Kalachanne Gowda, N.S.S. Programme Co-ordinator of University of Mysore and convener of the two day national seminar delivered the presidential address. Sri.K.M. Prasanna Kumar anchored the programme.

THE MYSURU DECLARATION (Recommendations of the two day national seminar)

At the end of the two day national seminar held at Mysuru under University of Mysore on 30 – 31, May, 2016, the following recommendations were unanimously accepted to be forwarded to the Government of India and to the State Government.

Some Areas of Concern

☐ Finance:

 In the past several decades N.S.S. grants never reached on time. This is a major handicap for programme implementation. As N.S.S. has been declared to be a Central Sector Scheme from 2016-17, the Government of India may exercise the option of Direct Beneficiary (Universities) Transfer (DBT) than instead of routing through the State Governments.

- 2. Self Financing N.S.S. units have created a lot of confusion. The intentions behind the launch of this are definitely commendable, but its implementation needs to be evaluated and proper guidance is to be issued.
- 3. The Programme Co-ordinator and his support staff should work on full time basis. The expenditure on their salary and other contingent allowances must be reimbursed to the University by the Government of India.

□ Special Camping :

- 4. In the special camping programme 7 days are not enough to create a sustainable impact on the volunteers. This seminar recommends that we go back to the 10 days special camping programme wherever it is possible. If this is accepted by the Government of India, the University will follow up by attaching academic credits for the 10 day camp. Extra 03 days boarding charges may be met by the State Government fund or contributions.
- 5. Government of India should insist that special camping programmes be held in nearby rural areas/slums.
- 6. Durable community asset creation as well as formation of relevant people's organization must be on the agenda of the camp in the light of Millennium Development Goals/Sustainable Development Goals.

■ N.S.S. under H.R.D. Ministry :

7. Since N.S.S. is essentially an academic exercise run by the educational institutions,



it is appropriate to bring it under the ministry of H.R.D., both in the Central and in the State Government.

☐ Incentives:

- 8. Selection procedures for N.S.S. Indira Gandhi Award must be made more scientific and foolproof.
- 9. There are many Programme Officers who render meritorious service in N.S.S. It is proposed that their service after due scrutiny may be entered in their service records.

□ Programme Officers Training :

10. Training of Programme Officers needs to be made more effective by including transformative training methodologies and field exposures. It is proposed that the Programme Officers training should be of 13 days duration including 3 days of field work.

☐ Formation of an NGO of the students and functionaries who complete their term in N.S.S.:

11. There are many who would like to continue in the spirit of N.S.S. for personal development and social reconstruction. It is proposed that ex-N.S.S. volunteers and ex-Programme Officers may be encouraged to form an N.G.O. at the University level for this purpose.

□ N.S.S. Themes:

12. For the past 10 years the theme of N.S.S. was 'Healthy Youth for Healthy India'. In view of the technological revolution happening in the country and in the backdrop of globalization, it is proposed that 'Youth for Science and Scientific Attitude' may be adopted as the theme for the next 3 years, because "Science is life and without Science there is no life". The theme of the special camping programme may include subthemes - like 'Swatch Bharath', 'Skill India', 'Digital India', 'E-Governance',

'Make in India' and Science oriented programs may be considered. The selection of these subthemes may be left to the decision of the universities/directorates.

☐ CSR:

13. The Government of India may encourage the corporate sector to extend CSR funds for supplementing the financial support made available to N.S.S. units by the Government of India. Such funds may be used exclusively for creation of durable community assets.

□ Regular Activities :

14.To strengthen and to motivate regular N.S.S. activities at college unit level, a good supervisory mechanism should be developed.

□ Open Units :

15. It is recommended to start Open N.S.S.
