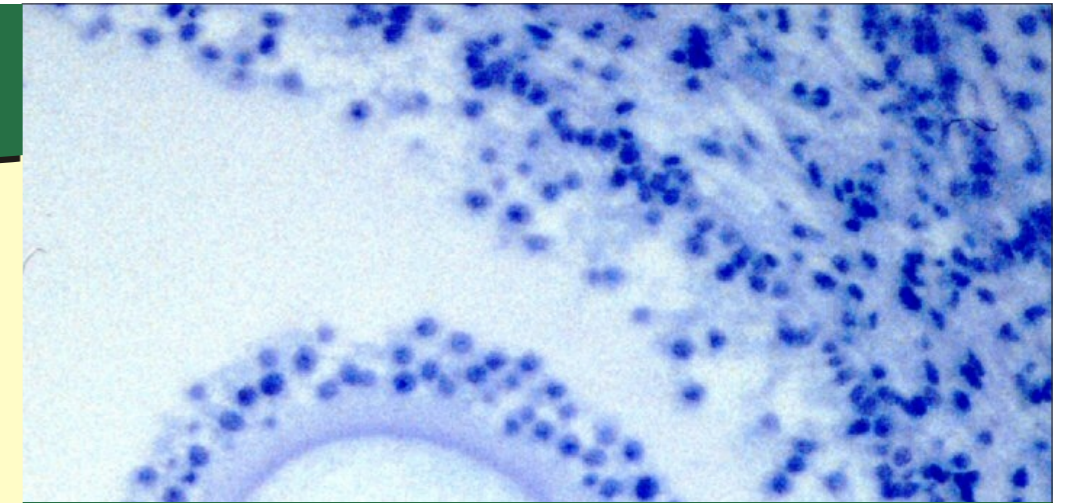

The Host University

The University of Mysore is among the foremost institution of its kind and is an enduring symbol in the sphere of higher education in India. The University was founded by the then Maharaja of Mysore, His Highness Sri Krishnaraja Wodeyar IV and his dewan, the renowned engineer-statesman Sir M. Visveshwaraiah on July 27th 1916. The University of Mysore became the first ever University in Karnataka and 5th in the country. The University became autonomous in 1956 and in 1960 the main campus of the University at the picturesque environment of Manasagangotri facing the serene Kukkarahally lake, was established. The name, "Manasagangotri" was suggested by the national poet K. V. Puttappa (Kuvempu), a former Vice-Chancellor of the University and a Jnana Peetha Awardee. In the last nine decades the University has served the cause of higher education with distinction. Most of the Post-graduate departments have gained international reputation and are known for their excellence in research. Besides teaching and research there are also a host of job-oriented diploma and certificate courses to cater to the needs of various offices and industries. The University has been successively graded with 5 stars in the year 1999 and with A+ in 2006 by National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC). Very recently, University of Mysore has been awarded Grant of Rs. 100 crores by the Government of India for its academic excellence.

The Host Department

The Department of Studies in Zoology, Manasagangotri was established in the year 1960, under the stewardship of late Prof. M. R. Rajashekarasetty, along with late Prof. B. N. Bole Gowda and Prof. M. Appaswamy Rao. Since the inception, the Department has immensely contributed in the fields of Reproductive Physiology, Comparative Endocrinology and *Drosophila* Genetics, which have earned national and international recognition. Over the years, the Department has expanded the research activities leading to emergence of research groups in different fields viz., Vector Biology, Microbial Ecology, Anti Diabetic and Anti Fertility Studies, Human Genetics and Developmental Biology. The Research activities of the Department have been funded by different agencies viz., Ford Foundation, UGC, CSIR, DST, DBT, DAE, ICMR/ICAR and DRDO.

The Conference

Animal Physiology, a fascinating branch of animal science has attracted the researchers in diverse fields ranging from cellular and molecular biology to organismic biology. Studies on animal physiology on one hand reveal how so many kinds of animals adapt to variety of life styles and on the other enable us to understand functioning and malfunctioning of living tissues which is basis for developing the effective treatment to human diseases. Given this wide scope, it is not surprising that huge research data are generated which need to be reviewed periodically. Hence, to assess the present status, to share the recent findings among the peer groups and to provide a platform for interactions between young and senior scientists, a National level conference on "Recent Trends in Animal Physiology" is being organized.
