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BACKGROUND OF THE WORKSHOP

Universal health coverage (UHC) is one of the important parts of the government's healthcare agenda. The 12th Five Year Plan targets a long-term goal of UHC where "each individual would have assured access to a defined essential range of medicines and treatment at an affordable price, which would be entirely free for a large percentage of the population". According to a report by Indian Express (2015), The Planning Commission estimated that health problems push 39 million people every year into poverty; 47 per cent and 31 per cent of hospital admissions in rural and urban India respectively are financed by loans and asset sales; and 30 per cent in rural India and 20 per cent in urban areas go untreated due to financial constraints. In reality, the government of India currently providing some services free of charge to all of the population for some health issues. Only employees of the Indian railways or the beneficiaries of the Central government health services are getting all services free of charge. But still no state is providing all the services free of charge to all the population. It aims at achieving universal health coverage and delivering quality health care services to all at affordable cost. The National Health Protection Scheme, a promising programme will cover over 10 crore poor and vulnerable families (approximately 50 crore beneficiaries) providing coverage up to Rs 5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary hospitalization. The timely implementation of the scheme will be the cornerstone of a successful rollout. (from various sources). Ayushman Bharat Yojana or National Health Protection Schemeⁱ it is a program which aims to provide a service to create a healthy, capable and content new India. It has two goals, one, creating a network of health and wellness infrastructure across the nation to deliver comprehensive primary healthcare services, and another is to providing insurance cover to at least 40 per cent of India's population which is majorly deprived of secondary and tertiary care services. This workshop is to identify the issues and challenges to achieve universal health coverage in the country;
