The collected Data and Materials should be organized, analyzed and prepare the typed dissertation in A4 size along with Photographs, Drawings, Maps, Picture Post Cards etc. along with bibliography at the end. This dissertation should be minimum of 50 pages and in a bound form. Dissertation should be submitted to the Department before Exams of the II Semester.
