Bangalore, Nov 24 (UNI) The 523rd birth anniversary of Sri Kanakadasa, the legendary poet, composer and philosopher, was celebrated across Karnataka today.

Karnataka Kannada and Culture Minister Govind Karjol presented the Kanaka Shree, a state award named after 16th century saintpoetknown for his 'keerthans' and struggle against the caste system to Professor Sudhakar.

The award was set up to honour persons who work in the promotion of the values preached by Kanakadasa in his keerthans on social evils like caste system. It carries a cash component of Rs five lakh and a plaque.

The state government has declared the birthday of Kanakadas as a state holiday with celebrations across the state for promoting the ideology and philosophy of Kanakadas who hailed from backward pastoral community.

# 4th Gen Electronic warfare system by 2012 - DRDO



Bangalore, Nov 24 (UNI) India's ownfourth generation Electronic Warfare System (EWS) will be ready to be flown onboard a MIG 29 fighter by 2012 rpt 2012, a top official of the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) said today.

DRDO told newspersons on the sidelines of the Inaugural AOC India National EW Workshop here. "EWS is becoming a very important aspect of modern warfare systems. To equip the armed forces with the best EW systems, DRDO would be setting up two testing ranges — one Chitradurga Karnataka and the other near Hyderabad. While the former will be communication based test range the latter would be a non-communication EW testing range," he said.

He said DRDO had

communication test range in Chitradurga as EW testing in Hyderabad, where DRDO has established an a e r o n a u t i c a l communication based testing range, could not carried out after the city administration expressed fears that civilian communication could be affected.

In the two ranges, DRDO would conduct tests like radiation and evaluation, do multiple target testing and try out smart way of jamming the rival radar systems and so on.

"EW posed a big challenge and it could not be conducted near the urban areas as the high power jamming technology employed in EW could affect communication set up and adars in the cities and airports," he said.

Dr Prahlada said Karnataka government had acquired about 4,000 acres of land in Chitradurga and handed it ver to DRDO. Work on the test rage would start shortly

build a runway. "By 2012 it would start operating," he said. The 8,000-acre Hyderabad facility, at Tandur about 150 km from the Andhra Pradesh state headquarters, DRDO would be setting up a noncommunication EW testing range. Two testing ranges are necessary for the country to ensure proper simulation and integration of the EW systems, he said.

He said Defence Avionics Development Establishment, a city-based DRDO lab, was on a 'high speed' mode to develop indigenous EW system and it had already integrated third generation systems on two MIG-27 and they were flying very successfully.

IAF has given good support. HAL Nashik is doing the integration it has modified two aircraft and both are flying. He said BEL and HAL would be jointly producing the equipment developed at the DRDO labs like IRDE and DEL in Dehradoon.

### 'Education system should create thinking minds': Maharastra Governor

Mumbai, Nov 24 (UNI) The Governor of Maharashtra K Sankaranarayanan today observed that the present education system laid considerable emphasis on learning by rote and writing answers by memorising.

Mentioning that there is no incentive for innovative or original thinking, he called upon teachers and principals to create a pool of thinking minds. While promoting academic excellence, schools must encourage students to excel in sports, arts and other cocurricular activities, he said.

The Governor was addressing a gathering of ICSE school principals assembled for the 53rd Annual Conference of the Association of Schools for Indian School Certificate, organised by the Ryan International Group of Institutions here. More than 1,200 school principals from different parts of the country are attending the conference.

The Governor said at a time when India was emerging as a



knowledge-based economy, it was ironical that as large as 88 per cent of the youth were out of the higher education system. He said while attaining the objective of quantitative expansion of the education system at all levels, schools must not lose sight of the quality aspect of education.

The Governor made a fervent appeal to the principals and teachers to make learning pleasurable and stress-free. He said it pains him immensely when he reads reports of

young boys and girls committing suicides due to stress. He also appealed parents and teachers not to place burden of high expectations on the students.

## **Transportation department generates** a revenue of Rs 932 crore



Bhopal, Nov 24 (UNI) As a result of modernisation of transport arrangements and use of hi-tech methods, Madhya Pradesh's transport department has generated a revenue of Rs 932 crore in 2009-10 — more than the stipulated target of Rs 900

With this, the department has achieved a growth of 20.50 per cent in revenue as compared to previous year, which is also the highest increase in revenue in the history of the transport department, an official release said here today.

With the objective of streamlining the entire transport system in the state, the system has been fully computerised.

An e-service has been started for the benefit of citizens under which entire information about vehicles can be obtained through website or SMS. Besides, online payment of taxes has also been launched and about 75 per cent such revenue is being received

Other innovative measures taken by the department include computerisation of transport check posts, arrangement of online applications and redressal, establishment of a call centre at Gwalior for providing information to owners of commercial vehicles and use of such a software to check tax evasion which ensures that the vehicle owner gets the related documents only after paying the stipulated fees and taxes.

Besides, tax intelligence system and computerised integrated check posts have also been introduced, which have led not only to transparency in the department but also the monitoring and implementation have gained momentum.

### 2-year-old become prey of leopard

Shimla, Nov 24 (UNI) A twoyears-old kid was killed by a Leopard, at Gobalthi village under Rampur subdivision of this district. The half eaten body of the kid was recovered by the affected family this morning, police sources said today.

Vinay, son of Gobind Singh, was playing with his grandmother last night, when suddenly he was



attacked by a wild leopard, who dragged the kid to jungle.

The family members along with other villagers tried to find the taken away kidin every nook and corner of nearby forest but they could not recover him from anywhere till falling of dawn.

Later, half eaten body of victim was recovered from nearby place lead to wailing of family members.

Wildlife range officer Rampur, B L Negi, who visited the affected family today said, efforts are on to trace the man eaters and he will be capture soon.
