BACKGROUND OF THE CONFERENCE:

The cities in India are projecting immense development with sky scrapers, fancy flyovers, massive shopping malls and multiplexes. However, what are co-existing are problem of poverty, inequality of income, exclusion, lack of basic infrastructural facilities etc., in urban areas. In India, most studies on poverty, exclusion, inequality have been centered on the rural areas and urban areas have received little attention of the policy makers and academicians. Though, both rural and urban areas struggle with the developmental problems the picture of urban poverty and exclusion is unique. Besides that, the urban problems have become major social problem all over the globe including India in the present era of globalization, resulting in unequal economic growth. Studies reveal that, despite various policies and programmes since independence, including recent policies like decentralization and giving more powers to urban local government bodies (ULBs) and launching of the JNNURM in 2005, SJSRY, RAY, the situation of urban poor is still not improved up to a satisfactory level due to numerous reasons. With the more rapid growth of the Indian economy in recent years, which is expected to continue, the rate of urbanization will increase and at the same time urban problems too. In this context the need of the hour is to discuss the urban problems in-depth and give suitable and divergent policy measures to bring urban poor and excluded sections into mainstream development. this now the mega mission to make 100 big cities as 'smart cities' has been launched. Apart from this disparities within the cities weakened the political legitimacy and undermined the development gains. Inequalities within cities have the potential to turn into social protests and generate social instability. It is, therefore, at this level that social justice and equity issues need to be addressed in order to create a fair and just social order that will bring harmony in economic and societal relations.

Against this background the core rationale of the proposed conference is an attempt to have solid discourse on various problems being faced by the urban excluded sections and also to suggest suitable policy measures to be implemented soon. This conference will provide a common platform for current discussion, sharing ideas, exploring reasons for inequality, social exclusion, financial exclusion, poverty, lack of basic infrastructural facilities etc. The deliberations would also reflect the empirical assessment of the implications of liberalization, privatization, globalization and other relevant changes on urban poor in India. Besides this an in-depth discussion will be made on how the process of urbanization in India can be made sustainable so as to provide basic amenities to all its citizens, create jobs and alleviate poverty, and lead to healthy and inclusive cities, which also contribute to the prosperity of rural areas. The conference aims to reflect on some of the pressing issues like, rising inequality in urban India; reasons for increasing urban poverty, reasons and suggestions to social exclusion in urban areas, nature and pace of migration to urban centres; displacement of slum-dwellers and other linked issues with regard to urban poverty and development.

- 2. To probe into the issues contributing towards increasing urban poverty and inequality and exclusion;
