

Concept Note:

The Importance of Empirical Economics and Econometric methods have greatly increased during the last two decades due to the availability of better data and the use of computers and statistical packages. In this information-driven world we need quickly to obtain complete and convincing statistical results. This is only possible if the appropriate econometric methods are applied. With this end, this workshop provides the participants both with the required insight in econometric methods and with the practical training needed for successful applications.

Researchers, academicians and practitioners will regularly be confronted with results of quantitative economic and business research. Therefore they must have knowledge about quantitative econometric methods: they should know how models arise, what the underlying assumptions are, and in what way estimates of parameters or other economic quantities are computed. This workshop meets all these requirements. In this course, economic theory is combined with econometric practice by showing and exercising its use with software packages.

Through this workshop participants will get a clear understanding of econometric practice and the underlying econometric theory. The integration of econometric theory, its application and the use of econometric software distinguishes this workshop from other workshops in econometrics. The main feature of the workshop is the strong integration of econometric theory and matching software to apply the theory.

About the University:

The University of Mysore was established on 27th July, 1916 during the benevolent reign of the Maharaja of Mysore, His Highness Nalvadi Krishnaraja Wodevar (1884-1940). The genesis of the University of Mysore stems from a five year long in-depth reading and analysis on higher education across the globe. The mission of the University of Mysore, laid down in the 1916 regulations published in the Mysore Gazette Extraordinary, aims at 'promoting teaching and research in conventional and traditional domains of Arts, Humanities, Pure and Applied Sciences and Professional disciplines'. Beginning with just 11 departments in 1916 today it has grown to strength of 54 Post graduate departments, three post graduate centres, four constituent colleges, 202 affiliated colleges, 49 recognized research centres and 38 outreach centres spread over different parts of the country and abroad. UoM is the mother of four Universities including Bangalore University, Mangalore University, Kuvempu University, Shivamogga and Karnataka State Open University. It has been accredited for the third time by NAAC with the score of 3.47 point scale and A- Grade. Current Science has ranked the University of Mysore as one of the top 20 Universities in Scientific and Research activities.

Nanjundappa, Dr. K. Venkatagirigowda, Dr. G.T. Thimmaiah, Dr. K.S. Nanjundaih and Mr. S. Rangachar of World Bank, Dr. V.K.R.V. Rao, Dr. Raja Chellaiah, Prof. Cynthia Wyaat, Dr. Rangararajan, Prof. Panchamukhi are some of the distinguished visitors in the last few decades. The Department holds distinction of having Dr. M. Madaiah, Prof. S. Bisalaiah, Prof. S. Indumati and Prof. Manjappa. D. Hosamani, served as Vice Chancellors of University of Mysore, University of Agricultural Sciences, GKVK (Bengaluru), Davanagere University, and Vijayanagara Sri Krishnadevaraya University, respectively making department proud and bringing it laurels.

The department offers M.A. in Economics, M.A. in Co-operative Management, M.Phil in Economics and Ph.D in both Economics and Co-operation with Course work. The Vision of the Department is to prepare students and researchers as competent economists globally and contribute for the nation's progress through inclusive growth and sustainable development.

In this pursuit, the Department has State Bank of Mysore Endowment Chair instituted in 1996 and Planning Commission Endowment Chair instituted in 2004, Planning Forum, Endowment Lectures organized all throughout the year, faculty club, and Computer facility.
