



About MYSORE CITY

Mysore is the third largest city in the state of Karnataka, India, which served as the capital city of Mysore Princely Kingdom (Kingdom of Mysore) for nearly six centuries. Located at the base of the Chamundi Hills about 146 km (91 miles) southwest of the state capital Bangalore.

The Kingdom of Mysore was ruled by the Wodeyar dynasty. Patrons of art and

culture, the Wodeyars contributed significantly to the cultural growth of the city. The cultural ambience and achievements of Mysore earned it the sobriquet Cultural capital of Karnataka.

Mysore renowned for personalities such as Tippu Sultan and Sir M. Vishweshwaraiah, is also noted for its palaces, including the Mysore Palace.

The festivities that take place during the Dasara festival when the city receives a large number of tourists is world famous. It lends its name to the Mysore style of painting, the sweet dish Mysore Pak, the Mysore Peta (a traditional silk turban) and the garment known as the Mysore silk saree.

About MYSORE MEDICAL COLLEGE

The prestigious Mysore Medical College & Research Institute (previously called Mysore Medical College), also known as Government Medical College, is one of the oldest medical colleges in India.

In 1924 the "Mysore Medical School" was upgraded and was now called the "Mysore Medical College". The college was affiliated to the University of Mysore and the trainees were now granted Medical Degrees. Mysore Medical College was the first medical college in the state of Mysore and only the seventh in the





whole country at that time. At the request and insistence of Sri Krishnadevaraja Wodiyar the College was shifted from Bangalore to Mysore in 1930.

At Department of Community Medicine we bring health education to the community. Our students and faculty are involved with educating the community about health and prevention of diseases and injury. We teach health professionals and community groups, conduct research and offer consultation and service.

About the CONFERENCE

2015 is the year for the achievement of Millenium Development Goals. While accomplishments are celebrated and

acknowledged, Concerns are raised about the unevenness, gaps in achievements and unmet special challenges are identified. Embedded in the main philosophy of social science profession is to strive for social justice

Abstract Submission:

- Abstracts of only those registered as delegates for this conference will be considered.
- Copy of the same abstract as additional hard copy may be sent.
- Each member is restricted to present one oral or one poster presentation.
- Abstract should not be more than 250 words excluding title, author and institutional affiliation.
- Typed matter should be in A4 size paper with standard margins, Arial font, size 12, line spacing 1.5 word document should be saved in MS office 2003, 2007 mode only.
- Abstract should be structured as Title, objectives, observations and conclusion.
- All abstracts would be peer reviewed and the scientific committee reserves the right to assign it as oral or poster presentation.
- Accepted abstracts will be listed on the conference's website by 25th August 2015.
- Paper presentation: Time allotted is 10 min. (8 min for presenting & 2 min for questions / discussion). Timings will be strictly followed.
